

Eucharistic Adoration • Heart's Deepest Longing

This week we enter into our second stage in learning how to do a self-examination whenever we sense sin (or the occasion of sin) entering our lives. This stage is the General Examination. What this means is we take two, or maybe three times every day and devote a short time-minutes-where we exclusively ask ourselves to give an account of the way we've been living since our last examination. This mental exercise is between God and us, and no one else. During this process we first return thanks to God and ask Him for divine light, then inspect ourselves and scrutinize ourselves concerning all that has happened since our last time concerning things within us and exterior to us. Examine your thoughts, words, and deeds (this is why we pray, "...in my thoughts, in my words, in what I have done, and in what I have failed to do" during the Penitential Act during Mass). Here, we must take a mental mark each time we have sinned or failed, and of our defeats (what we struggle with). Take your heart and place it next to the Heart of Christ, compare and notice the difference between the thoughts, sensations, and actions of both. Bring to mind the life Christ led and how He behaved in what He said and did. Once having recognized your own shortcomings acknowledge your own unthankfullness for the divine favors which God offered that you didn't use. Then, in an act of sorrow, as perfect as possible, beg for grace to amend yourself and make better progress. Lastly, once your defeats are identified, work on rooting them out one-by -one; one vice or defect at a time and not all at once. We will continue with the second stage next week, for it has a lot of implications on our lives. - Paul Ray

Highlights from St. Mark's Bible Study

This week the theme was Faith not Fear. We studied Mark 4:35-41, The storm on the sea. Using Rembrandt's painting, "The Storm on the Sea of Galilee," showed us increase in fear will decrease faith and increased faith with help us to control our fear. We were asked to think about how we respond when we are in a storm. Do we fight the storm on our own, or do we cling to Jesus in faith. We also studied Mark 5:25-34, Jesus heals the hemorrhaging woman. This image is used in the Catechism of the Catholic Church to introduce the section on the Sacraments. It was chosen to remind us that we touch Jesus in the Sacraments. Lastly, we covered Mark 6:1-6. Jesus was unable to do mighty works. We limit what God wants to do when we don't have faith.

Michigan March for Life • November 6

The event begins with an 11:00AM rally in front of the Michigan State Capitol Building. Speakers include Mayra Rodriguez, Chuck Gaidica, Bishop Earl Boyea, and Amber Roseboom. The march begins at Noon, with a one mile walk around the Capitol Building. If you'd like to ride the bus from Ss Cyril & Methodius to Lansing with fellow pro-life marchers, the bus leaves at 8:00AM and returns between 4:00 and 5:00PM. November Indulgences for "The Holy Souls in Purgatory"

Please pray for the faithful departed throughout the month of November, and especially on November 2. The Church gives us ample opportunities today to help those suffering in Purgatory. All the faithful canseek to obtain a plenary indulgence for a soul in Purgatory. We would certainly want people to help us through their prayers if we go to Purgatory. And if we help get someone to Heaven, you can be sure that they will help us and pray for us before the Throne of God.

What is an indulgence? "Indulgences are a part of the Church's teaching on the forgiveness of sins. Through the Sacrament of Baptism, we receive forgiveness for our sins, and all punishment is remitted. Through the Sacrament of Penance, sins are also forgiven, and the eternal penalty that is due to sin—namely, damnation, the eternal loss of the presence of God—is taken away. However, consequences still remain that the sinner must bear. This is what is traditionally called the temporal punishment for sin. This consequence of sin disrupts our relationship with God, with the Church and with others. Those who have received forgiveness for their sins may still have an obligation to undergo a process of purification to restore these disrupted relationships. The necessary and painful process that brings this reconciliation and purification can take place in this life or in Purgatory, because whatever part of the process remains unfinished at death must be completed in Purgatory" (Indulgences and our Spiritual Life). An indulgence (full or partial) is what we receive when the Church lessens the temporal (lasting only for a short time) penalties to which we may be subject even though our sins have been forgiven.

Plenary (Full) Indulgence Available on All Souls Day (Sunday, November 2)

* Piously visit a church to pray for the faithful departed. * Say one "Our Father" and the "Creed" in the visit to the church. * Say one "Our Father" and one "Hail Mary" for the intentions of the Pope. * Worthily receive Holy Communion (ideally on the same day). * Make a Sacramental Confession within 20 days of (before or after).

All Souls Day Plenary Indulgence Available from November 1 to November 8

* Devoutly visit a cemetery and pray for the dead, even if the prayer is only mental. * Say one "Our Father" and one "Hail Mary" for the intentions of the Pope. * Worthily receive Holy Communion (ideally on the same day). * Make a Sacramental Confession within 20 days of (before or after) All Souls Day.

A partial indulgence, applicable only to the Souls in Purgatory, can be obtained when the Eternal Rest is prayed especially during the month of November: Eternal rest grant to them, O Lord, and let perpetual light shine upon them. May the souls of the faithful departed, through the mercy of God, rest in peace. Amen.

THE GENERAL CONDITIONS REQUIRED FOR GAINING A PLENARY INDULGENCE:

All attachment to sin, even venial sin, must be absent. If one's disposition is less than perfect or if some of the above conditions are not fulfilled, the indulgence becomes partial.

One must also remember that one can acquire only one plenary indulgence a day.

The above indulgences are applicable only to the Souls in Purgatory.

Several Plenary Indulgences may be gained on the basis of a single Sacramental Confession; only one may be gained, however, on the basis of a single Eucharistic Communion and prayer for the Pope's intentions.

COMMEMORATION OF ALL THE FAITHFUL DEPARTED


