Eucharistic Adoration • Heart's Deepest Longing

The process which was described in last week's article about the first step in self-examination is powerful. Its efficacy is incredible. It roots out one defect at a time in a way applicable to you alone and gives you the insight to your next move with a clear mind. Rest assured that there is no habit so deep-rooted, no vice so great, which, by using this technique, cannot be overcome and subdued. In God's grace we can do all things (Phil. 4:13) so never feel as if it's impossible. I've seen personally many people overcome what seemed to be something insurmountable. Whatever defeats, then, that you may have be of good cheer, be sure of your victory and know for the future how to act in any given circumstance. To recap: Attack, first, that vice or defect which may be a stumbling block, or a cause of offence against God, or to your neighbor; afterward, attack the one which seems to be your main fault by prayer in asking for strength, wisdom, knowledge and a willingness to cooperate. When the main fault is overcome the rest are easily overcome. In the morning, make a commitment to resolve firmly that during the rest of the day you will ignore what you can easily be avoided (avoiding near occasions to sin), then beg for grace that you may remain faithful this commitment. Then twice, or even once, during the day search yourself and see how often (since the last time you did this) you have failed and how many times. Grieve not only over your faults in general, but the particular faults themselves. Resolve, then again, to pray for God's grace to be able to defend yourself next time and the strength to work with Him. All of this learning and practice is best accomplished during Eucharistic Adoration. We will continue next week in the same light. - Paul Rav

The event begins with an 11:00AM rally in front of the Michigan State Capitol Building. Speakers include Mayra Rodriguez, Chuck Gaidica, Bishop Earl Boyea, and Amber Roseboom. The march begins at Noon, with a one mile walk around the Capitol Building. Highlights from St. Mark's Bible Study

This week we studied Mark's Gospel chapters 6 and 8. The focus was, "The Mystery of the Bread." We studied the miracles of the multiplication of loaves and fishes. Mark tells us that the actions and words of Jesus: take, bless, break and gives the bread, are repeated in the celebration of the Eucharist. The Apostles struggle to understand that Jesus is God due to disbelief. In conclusion, if we don't understand the mystery of the bread then we won't understand the mystery of Jesus.

You can visit our miraculous statue of the Sorrowful and Immaculate Heart of Mary in our Shrine-Grotto (the small building with the blue awning) and our signature statue, Our Lady of the Cape ("Notre Dame du Cap")-the Queen of Canada and Queen of the Most Holy Rosary-in the Chapel. It was thru one of her traveling statues that the Blessed Mother asked the pastor in 1947 at the Marian Congress in Ottawa, Canada, to start a shrine in Pontiac. 
