Monday, October 13th • Final Apparition of Our Lady of Fatima

Monday, October 13: Marian Procession, Devotions (& Social) after the Noon Holy Mass

During World War I, Pope Benedict XV made repeated but forlorn pleas for peace, and finally in May 1917, made a direct appeal to the Blessed Mother to intercede for peace in the world. Soon, Our Lady began to appear at Fatima, Portugal to three shepherd children, Lucia dos Santos, age 10, and her cousins, Francisco and Jacinta Marto, ages 9 and 7. Fatima was a small village about 70 miles north of Lisbon.

October 13, 1917

The prediction of a public miracle caused intense speculation throughout Portugal and the journalist, Avelino de Almeida, published a satirical article on the whole business in the anti-religious newspaper "O Seculo." People from other parts of the country descended by the tens of thousands on the cova despite the terrible storm that lashed the mountain country around Fatima on the eve of the 13th. Many pilgrims walked barefooted, reciting the Rosary as they went, all crowding into the area around the cova. By mid-morning the weather again turned bad and heavy rain began to fall.

The children reached the holm oak around noon and then saw the flash of light as Mary appeared before them. For the last time, Lucia asked what she wanted: "I want to tell you that a chapel is to be built here in my honor. I am the Lady of the Rosary. Continue always to pray the Rosary every day. The war is going to end, and the soldiers will soon return to their homes."

Again Lucia made requests for cures, conversions and other things. Our Lady's response was: "Some yes, but not others. They must amend their lives and ask forgiveness for their sins."

Sister Lucia tells us that at this point Mary grew very sad and said: "Do not offend the Lord our God any more, because He is already so much offended." Then, opening her hands, she made them reflect on the sun and, as she ascended, the reflection of her own light continued to be projected on the sun itself. After she disappeared, as the people witnessed the great miracle which had been predicted, the children saw the visions foretold during the September apparition.

The Great Miracle of the Sun

The greatest miracle to occur since the Resurrection is also the only miracle ever precisely predicted as to date, time of day and location. Although it is popularly known as "The Miracle of the Sun" and October 13, 1917, has come to be known as "The Day the Sun Danced," a great deal more took place. The solar phenomena included the dancing of the sun, its fluctuations in color, its swirling and its descending toward the earth. There was also the stillness in the leaves of the trees in spite of howling winds, the complete drying of the rain-soaked ground and the restoration of clothes all wet and covered with mud so that, as eye-witness Dominic Reis, put it, "They looked as tho they had just come back from the cleaners." Physical cures of the blind and the lame were reported. The countless unreserved public confessions of sin and commitments to conversion of life attest to the authenticity of what they saw.

The miracle is reported to have been seen from as far as 15-25 miles away, thus ruling out the possibility of any type of collective hallucination or mass hypnotism. Doubters and skeptics had become believers. Even O Seculo's on-site reporter, Avelino de Almeida, now reported affirmatively and stood by his story later on in spite of harsh criticism.

Eucharistic Adoration • Heart's Deepest Longing

We will continue to follow the theme of how we handle sinning after our baptism and after having been to confession. This week we begin with the obtaining perfect purity of heart (Mt. 5:8; 5:48). It is not enough to simply cherish a good will; to meditate, pray frequently, and to confess often and devoutly. These are indeed very efficient and necessary, please don't get me wrong, and they should never be neglected or omitted. But alone they do not suffice. They do not tear out the roots of our vices and defects. In order to arrive at purity of heart, it is necessary to exterminate these roots to keep us pure. The method by which we can uproot these noxious roots is by self-examination, and exercise that is difficult indeed, for anyone. It's truly, however, a small matter but is very efficient. It reaches at that which divides our soul, aids in the discerning of spirits, and it searches the thoughts and intentions of our hearts. Not only does it serve to root out all evil habits and defects, but more wonderfully, it acquires for us solid virtue, and even the attaining of perfection. This examination is threefold. The first is to examine what takes place in and around us on a daily basis and with the help of the Holy Spirit, do what is necessary and act accordingly. The second, ask of yourself to give an account of yourself and conduct throughout the day what is normally called a "General Examination". Third, and lastly, the actual rooting out of the defect one at a time. The following weeks we will uncover the richness contained in these amazing exercises. I leave you with a quote from St. Alphonsus Ligouri from his masterpiece, "Uniformity to the Will of God" which I always bring to mind and will never forget: "The key to perfection is to be content in all circumstances; whether in times of prosperity, or in times of adversity." - Paul Ray

Total Consecration to Jesus through Mary is a beautiful exercise to increase our spirituality and ability to truly serve our Lord Jesus Christ. The basic premise set forth by St. Louis Marie de Montfort is simply that Jesus came into the world through Mary and that for us to always be assured of being close to Jesus, even closer than ever before, we should go thru Mary. St. Louis de Montfort (1673 – 1716) developed a 33-day devotion consisting of various prayers and readings to help us to grow in holiness and increase our faith and love for our Lord. It will help us to detach ourselves from the world and bond ourselves more closely with Christ thru the example and intercession of the Blessed Virgin Mary. Consecration to Jesus is for anyone, who is old enough to understand the love of Jesus and Mary. The preparation is intended to prepare our hearts and minds by praying and meditating.

### Spiritual Adoption Program • Next Weekend

**Saturday & Sunday, October 18 & 19**

After the Supreme Court legalized abortion in 1973, Archbishop Fulton J. Sheen composed a prayer to let the faithful know that they ARE NOT powerless against anti-life forces:

*Jesus, Mary and Joseph, I love you very much.*

*I beg you to spare the life of the unborn baby [baby's name]*

*that I have spiritually adopted who is in danger of abortion.*

Next weekend, October 18 & 19, you will have the opportunity to spiritually adopt an unborn baby who is in danger of abortion by signing up individually or as a family. Your mission is to pray the above prayer everyday for the unborn child for 9 months (October-June). There will be red hearts to place on a poster, and you can name your baby to give the baby the humanity he or she deserves. There will be monthly reports in the bulletin and posters on the wall describing your baby's development. We will celebrate our babies during our annual Lenten Baby Shower.
