

We're at the point now where our self-examination for making progress toward union with God in purity and perfection has brought us to having Him provide for us a spiritual director; a person we can rely on to aid us in guiding us in the spiritual life. Once we have found one, and both parties agree in taking on this venture, the question begs to be asked: Now what? We start by disclosing our interior manifestations to them. This means disclosing the souls state: Are we peaceful or agitated? How much do we actually long for a more perfect state in life with God? What obstacles embarrass us? What type of practices of devotion and mortification do we already do? What is our method in prayer and meditation? What fruits have we noticed as a result of this method in our lives? What spiritual books are we reading and studying? Do we understand and comprehend what we read? Are we able to take what we read and put it into practice? Are we happy in our method and current degree in our interior life? We can tell them our manner of how we approach the Sacraments. How do we prepare for them, how do we give thanks for them, and what are the results? How have we been making our self-examination before we found a spiritual director? What was painstaking? What was fruitful from it? These are just a few things to consider when God desires for us to grow in deeper intimacy with Him and has provided someone to help us along the way. Think about all of these before Christ, truly present in the Blessed Sacrament, at Eucharistic Adoration. He has a special love for those who truly and sincerely desire to unite themselves with him! - Paul Rav

Highlights from St. Mark's Bible Study

This week we continued to follow Jesus through Holy Week from the end of Mark chapter 12 thru chapter 14. We covered the prophecy of the destruction of the Temple. This prophecy is framed by two acts of generosity by two women. One is of a widow that gives all she has to the Temple treasury and the second woman that anoints Jesus with expensive nard who is the new Temple. The parable in chapter 13 talking about being watchful was covered. The four watches: evening, midnight, cockcrow, and morning are the four watches of the Roman soldiers which will serve as the structure for the Passion. Lastly, we compared the actions of Jesus in the miracles of the multiplication of the loaves found in Mark 6:41 and 8:6 to the actions of Jesus at the Last Supper institution of the Eucharist in Mark 14-22-24. Jesus takes bread, blesses it, breaks it, and gives it to his Apostles.


Please Sign Up! Christmas Cookie Walk & Bake Sale December 13 & 14, 2025

2025 Parish Advent Giving Projects

Today, on the Solemnity of Our Lord Jesus Christ, King of the Universe, the Church celebrates the culmination of the liturgical year. Very soon, the new liturgical year will begin with Advent, commemorating the dawn of Christ's restoration of justice and peace. To help us prepare for Advent and ensure that donations can be distributed before Christmas, the Giving Tree is now up and decorated with gift-request tags. The Giving Tree recipients, along with the other parish Advent projects, are listed here so each of us can plan how we would like to participate in the parish's Advent giving to the vulnerable and needy.

Giving Tree Gift Requests: These items go to individuals served by one of the following programs named below:

Select a gift tag from the tree. Written on the gift tags are specific gift requests. Please attach the gift tag to the wrapped gift.

Please deliver wrapped gifts with the gift tag firmly attached and drop off before any weekend Holy Mass but no later than Monday, December 8. Gift cards may be placed in the Sunday collection basket any weekend but no later than Sunday, December 14 or drop them off in the Parish Office during regular office hours.

- Macomb County Community and Mental Health: Children and families assisted by the county are the recipients of the request for Giving Tree specific gifts.
- We have Parish and Neighborhood Families in Need that are the recipients of the request for specific gifts as well as requests for gift cards as noted on the tree gift tag.
- St. Dominic's Outreach Center has requested \$25 or \$50 Walmart or Kroger gift cards for the children and seniors in their community.
- Mary's Children Family Center requests gifts cards from Costco, Gordon Food Service (GFS), Meijer and Kroger in either \$25 or \$50 amounts. These will be used to purchase birthday and Christmas gifts, supplies and materials needed for their students and programs.

Monetary Donations to Local Ministries - White Envelopes or PushPay

During the month of December, donations to the Parish Christian Service Fund will be distributed between these ministries listed below. Donations to the Parish Christian Service Fund can be made online via PushPay; or place cash or a check made out to Ss. Cyril & Methodius in a white Advent Giving envelope and put it in the Sunday collection basket no later than December 25.

- Image of God Crisis Pregnancy Centers: Women experiencing a crisis pregnancy find friendly and much-needed assistance at Image of God's three centers, one of which is in nearby Madison Heights. The centers help women set goals and provide for their own and their baby's needs from pregnancy through the baby's first 2 years. Our donation will help cover Image of God's operational costs so they can continue their lifesaving and life affirming mission in 2026.
- St. Christine's Christian Services is located in the Brightmoor neighborhood of Detroit. Their soup kitchen and food pantry currently feeds 500 people each week. Our donation to their general fund will go toward purchasing fresh foods, paying utility bills or wherever most needed.

International Monetary Donations – Use the Blue Envelope for these donations.

To donate to either or both of these projects, indicate the amount of your donation for the program(s) you wish to donate to, and place it in the Sunday collection basket no later than December 25.

Note: per the IRS, this international donation is not tax deductible.

- Slovak Seminary Donation: Future priests from all five Slovak dioceses are currently studying at St. Gorazd Seminary in Nitra. This year 50 theology students are in formation at St. Gorazd. This annual donation from our parish is a small way for us to support the church in Slovakia. Rather than a direct sponsorship, our donation will be used at the rector's discretion to provide financial assistance or to help fund retreats or other formation events.
- Catholic Medical Clinic in Kahama, Tanzania: The town of Kahama, home of our sister parish Holy Family, desperately needs a medical clinic for immediate medical concerns. Since Bishop Christophe's last visit to our parish, construction of a building for this clinic started but additional funds are needed to complete this much-needed Catholic medical clinic. The incomplete project is currently at a stand-still. Our donations will allow construction to continue and move closer to providing this loving and essential resource to the people of Kahama that cares for each patient's heart and soul.
