



Catechísm



Eucharistic Adoration Heart's Deepest Longing On First Fridays, Adoration takes place from Thursday, 1:00PM - First Friday, 7:00PM.

This week in our learning about self-examination, having found a spiritual director, and a longing to unite our wills with God's. I desire to focus on a specific aspect of ourselves which is of the utmost

importance in our advancing: Purity of Heart. We've heard Jesus' words, "Blessed are the pure of heart, for they shall see God" (Mt. 5:8) in the Beatitudes. But how does one discover if they're pure of heart or how to we achieve its purity? The first step to achieve purity of heart is to settle and have a consistent determination to always trying to improve. The second, repeated mental (prayer from our heart) and vocal (set written prayers) prayer. The third, the pious and frequent use of the Sacraments. The fourth, the faithful practice of the three-fold self-examination, especially our particular examination with our spiritual advisor. The fifth, the candid disclosing of our interior life to them. Whoever makes the right use of these three-fold means will doubtless attain to as great a purity of heart as our Lord ordinarily desires and is required. If the Lord requires something from us that is extraordinary, He Himself will give us the means to attain it. No one is able to achieve purity of heart on their own, we need help, we need His grace and this is precisely how we get it. If we happen to grow lukewarm (which will normally happen), re-examine yourself from time-to-time and make known how you have cooperated with the grace God sent you and how you haven't. As long as you use these, even with ordinary diligence, you have within yourself the consoling sign: that you are on the right road which leads to perfection. - Paul Ray



You can visit our miraculous statue of the Sorrowful and Immaculate Heart of Mary in our Shrine-Grotto (the small building with the blue awning) and our signature statue, Our Lady of the Cape ("Notre Dame du Cap")-the Queen of Canada and Queen of the Most Holy Rosary-in the Chapel. It was thru one of her traveling statues that the Blessed Mother asked the pastor in 1947 at the Marian Congress in Ottawa. Canada, to start a shrine in Pontiac.



2025 Parish Advent Giving Projects

Today, on the Solemnity of Our Lord Jesus Christ, King of the Universe, the Church celebrates the culmination of the liturgical year. Very soon, the new liturgical year will begin with Advent, commemorating the dawn of Christ's restoration of justice and peace. To help us prepare for Advent and ensure that donations can be distributed before Christmas, the Giving Tree is now up and decorated with gift-request tags. The Giving Tree recipients, along with the other parish Advent projects, are listed here so each of us can plan how we would like to participate in the parish's Advent giving to the vulnerable and needy.



Giving Tree Gift Requests: These items go to individuals served by one of the following programs named below:

Select a gift tag from the tree. Written on the gift tags are specific gift requests. Please attach the gift tag to the wrapped gift. Please deliver wrapped gifts with the gift tag firmly attached and drop off before any weekend Holy Mass but no later than Monday, December 8. Gift cards may be placed in the Sunday collection basket any weekend but no later than Sunday, December 14 or drop them off in the Parish Office during regular office hours.

- Macomb County Community and Mental Health: Children and families assisted by the county are the recipients of the request for Giving Tree specific gifts.
- We have Parish and Neighborhood Families in Need that are the recipients of the request for specific gifts as well as requests for gift cards as noted on the tree gift tag.
- St. Dominic's Outreach Center has requested \$25 or \$50 Walmart or Kroger gift cards for the children and seniors in their community.
- Mary's Children Family Center requests gifts cards from Costco, Gordon Food Service (GFS), Meijer and Kroger in either \$25 or \$50 amounts. These will be used to purchase birthday and Christmas gifts, supplies and materials needed for their students and programs.

Monetary Donations to Local Ministries - White Envelopes or PushPay

During the month of December, donations to the Parish Christian Service Fund will be distributed between these ministries listed below. Donations to the Parish Christian Service Fund can be made online via PushPay; or place cash or a check made out to Ss. Cyril & Methodius in a white Advent Giving envelope and put it in the Sunday collection basket no later than December 25.

- Image of God Crisis Pregnancy Centers: Women experiencing a crisis pregnancy find friendly and much-needed assistance at Image of God's three centers, one of which is in nearby Madison Heights. The centers help women set goals and provide for their own and their baby's needs from pregnancy through the baby's first 2 years. Our donation will help cover Image of God's operational costs so they can continue their lifesaving and life affirming mission in 2026.
- St. Christine's Christian Services is located in the Brightmoor neighborhood of Detroit. Their soup kitchen and food pantry currently feeds 500 people each week. Our donation to their general fund will go toward purchasing fresh foods, paying utility bills or wherever most needed.

International Monetary Donations – Use the Blue Envelope for these donations.

To donate to either or both of these projects, indicate the amount of your donation for the program(s) you wish to donate to, and place it in the Sunday collection basket no later than December 25.

Note: per the IRS, this international donation is not tax deductible.

- Slovak Seminary Donation: Future priests from all five Slovak dioceses are currently studying at St. Gorazd Seminary in Nitra. This year 50 theology students are in formation at St. Gorazd. This annual donation from our parish is a small way for us to support the church in Slovakia. Rather than a direct sponsorship, our donation will be used at the rector's discretion to provide financial assistance or to help fund retreats or other formation events.
- Catholic Medical Clinic in Kahama, Tanzania: The town of Kahama, home of our sister parish Holy Family, desperately needs a medical clinic for immediate medical concerns. Since Bishop Christophe's last visit to our parish, construction of a building for this clinic started but additional funds are needed to complete this much-needed Catholic medical clinic. The incomplete project is currently at a stand-still. Our donations will allow construction to continue and move closer to providing this loving and essential resource to the people of Kahama that cares for each patient's heart and soul.
