EXAMINATION OF CONSCIENCE FOR ADULTS

1. I am the Lord your God. You shall not have strange gods before me.

- Do I give God time every day in prayer?
 Do I seek to love Him with my whole heart?
- · Have I been involved with superstitious practices or have I been involved with the occult?
 - Do I seek to surrender myself to God's word as taught by the Church?
 - Have I ever received communion in the state of mortal sin?
- Have I ever deliberately told a lie in Confession or have I withheld a mortal sin from the priest in Confession?
 - Are there other "gods" in my life? Money, Security, Power, People, etc.?

2. You shall not take the name of the Lord your God in vain.

- Have I used God's name in vain: lightly or carelessly? Have I been angry with God?
- Have I wished evil upon any other person?
 Have I insulted a sacred person or abused a sacred object?
 3. Remember to keep holy the Lord's Day.
 - Have I deliberately missed Mass on Sundays or Holy Days of Obligation?
- Have I tried to observe Sunday as a family day and a day of rest? Do I do needless work on Sunday?

4. Honor your father and your mother.

- Do I honor and obey my parents? Have I neglected my duties to my spouse and children?
 - Do I try to bring peace into my home life?
- Have I given my family good religious example?
 Do I care for my aged and infirm relatives?

5. You shall not kill.

- Have I had an abortion or encouraged or helped anyone to have an abortion?
 Have I physically harmed anyone?
 - Have I abused alcohol or drugs?
 Have I participated in or approved of euthanasia?
 - Did I give scandal to anyone, thereby leading him or her into sin?
 - Have I been angry or resentful? Have I harbored hatred in my heart?
 - Have I mutilated myself through any form of sterilization? Have I encouraged or condoned sterilization?
 - · Have I engaged, in any way, in sins against human life such as artificial insemination or in vitro fertilization?

6. You shall not commit adultery.

- Have I been faithful to my marriage vows in thought and action?
 - · Have I engaged in any sexual activity outside of marriage?
- · Have I used any method of contraception or artificial birth control in my marriage?
- · Has each sexual act in my marriage been open to the transmission of new life?
- Have I been guilty of masturbation?
 Do I seek to control my thoughts and imaginations?
- Have I respected all members of the opposite sex, or have I thought of other people as mere objects?
 Have I been quilty of any homosexual activity?
 - Do I seek to be chaste in my thoughts, words, actions?
 Am I careful to dress modestly?

7. You shall not steal.

- Have I stolen what is not mine?
 Have I returned or made restitution for what I have stolen?
- Do I waste time at work, school, and home? Do I gamble excessively, thereby denying my family of their needs?
 - Do I pay my debts promptly?
 Do I seek to share what I have with the poor?
 - · Have I cheated anyone out of what is justly theirs, for example creditors, insurance companies, big corporations?

8. You shall not bear false witness against your neighbor.

- Have I lied? Have I gossiped?
 Do I speak badly of others behind their back?
- Am I sincere in my dealings with others?
 Am I critical, negative or uncharitable in my thoughts of others?
 - Do I keep secret what should be kept confidential? Have I injured the reputation of others by slanders?

9. You shall not desire your neighbor's wife.

- Have I consented to impure thoughts?
 Have I caused them by impure reading, movies, television, conversation or curiosity?
 Do I pray at once to banish impure thoughts and temptations?
 - Have I behaved in an inappropriate way with members of the opposite sex: flirting, being superficial, etc.?

10. You shall not desire your neighbor's goods.

- Am I jealous of what other people have? Do I envy the families or possessions of others?
 - Am I greedy or selfish? Are material possessions the purpose of my life? National Catholic Register

Gift Cards (DUE THIS WEEKEND ONLY):

- St. Dominic's Outreach Center has requested \$25 or \$50 gift cards from Walmart or Kroger for the children and seniors in their community.
- Mary's Children Family Center has requested \$25 or \$50 gift cards from Costco, Gordon Food Service (GFS), Meijer or Kroger. These will be used to purchase birthday and Christmas gifts, supplies and materials needed for their students and programs.

Local Monetary Donations - White Envelopes or PushPay for these donations (until December 25):

During the month of December, donations to the Parish Christian Service Fund will be distributed between these ministries listed below. Donations to the Parish Christian Service Fund can be made online via PushPay; or place cash or a check made out to Ss. Cyril & Methodius in a white Advent Giving envelope and put it in the Sunday collection basket no later than December 25.

- Image of God Crisis Pregnancy Centers: Women experiencing a crisis pregnancy find friendly and much-needed assistance at Image of God's three centers, one of which is in nearby Madison Heights. The centers help women set goals and provide for their own and their baby's needs from pregnancy through the baby's first 2 years. Our donation will help cover Image of God's operational costs so they can continue their lifesaving and life affirming mission in 2026.
- St. Christine's Christian Services is located in the Brightmoor neighborhood of Detroit. Their soup kitchen and food pantry currently feeds 500 people each week. Our donation to their general fund will go toward purchasing fresh foods, paying utility bills or wherever most needed.

International Monetary Donations - Blue Envelope for these donations (until December 25):

To donate to either or both of these projects, indicate the amount of your donation for the program(s) you wish to donate to, and place it in the Sunday collection basket no later than December 25.

Note: per the IRS, this international donation is not tax deductible.

- Slovak Seminary Donation: Future priests from all five Slovak dioceses are currently studying at St. Gorazd Seminary in Nitra. This year 50 theology students are in formation at St. Gorazd. This annual donation from our parish is a small way for us to support the church in Slovakia. Rather than a direct sponsorship, our donation will be used at the rector's discretion to provide financial assistance or to help fund retreats or other formation events.
- Catholic Medical Clinic in Kahama, Tanzania: The town of Kahama, home of our sister parish Holy Family, desperately needs a medical clinic for immediate medical concerns. Since Bishop Christophe's last visit to our parish, construction of a building for this clinic started but additional funds are needed to complete this much-needed Catholic medical clinic. The incomplete project is currently at a stand-still. Our donations will allow construction to continue and move closer to providing this loving and essential resource to the people of Kahama that cares for each patient's heart and soul.


Christmas Novena Begins December 26

Eucharistic Adoration Heart's Deepest Longing

We have already spoken about understanding ourselves in view of self-mastery over our interior enemies, i.e., our sinful inclinations, evil tendencies, our weaknesses and trends. This week we start our look at the other enemy of our soul: the world. In

our day-in-age, the ways of the world are inescapable. They infiltrate all aspects of society and the very things that surround us every day. What makes the world so toxic to our soul? It is because the ways of the world favor every vice within us whether they are openly or secretly. The Heart of Christ, on the other hand, breathes nothing except what is holy, right, and true. Woe to the heart that clings to the world's allurements and vanities! It is not enough to cast Satan out of our hearts; we must also cast the world out as well. We have three enemies of our soul: The World, the Flesh, and the Devil. All of which vie for the capture of our soul and its attention. Therefore, if we inwardly still cherish the world and continue to strive to live according to the will of God we will gain very little. The world will continue to infect our heart, pervert it, and finally betray us into its power, which is into the power of demons. What is the "world" then? The ways of the world are what the enemy uses get us to accept, and to adhere to, an inordinate or perverse love of pleasure, riches, honors; by these things we corrupt ourselves and others around and associated with us. We will continue our look into the ways of the world in the weeks to come and see how we can combat them in striving to unite ourselves fully to God's will in our lives.

All participants receive a Certificate of Participation



Consecration to St. Joseph Prep Begins: Monday, December 22 Consecration (Performed Privately): January 23

Mary is our spiritual mother, and St. Joseph is our spiritual father. The spiritual fatherhood of St. Joseph is extremely important for our spiritual growth. Everything we have given to Jesus and Mary can also be given to St. Joseph. The hearts of Jesus, Mary, and St. Joseph are one.

Program Overview: Consecration to St. Joseph emulates the tried-and-true preparation method employed by St. Louis de Montfort in his Marian consecration, highlighting many of St. Joseph's titles, privileges, and heroic virtues. The program of preparation and consecration takes 33 days. You'll spend about 20-30 minutes a day on a short exposition on one of the invocations in the powerful Litany of St. Joseph, followed by a reading on St. Joseph, concluding with the recitation of the Litany of St. Joseph. If you miss a day, just make it up and continue your preparation. On the day of your consecration, feel free to use whichever act of consecration you like best; you can also make up your own, if you like. A limited number of books are available in the Parish Office for \$15.

Consecration to Jesus thru Mary Prep Begins: Wednesday, December 31 Consecration on the Presentation of the Lord: February 2

The next 33-day preparation for the Total Consecration to Jesus through Mary, St. Louis de Montfort, begins on Wednesday, December 31, for all who wish to make, or renew their Consecration on February 2, the Presentation of the Lord. Once you make the consecration, it is for life. It can then be renewed annually. This is a formal consecration to Our Lady, like a vow. You are giving Mary ALL of yourself - your heart, your mind, and your soul - in order to bring you closer and help you be more faithful to her Son, Jesus Christ and that she may use you as a holy instrument in her battle with Satan. She assists you, through the Holy Spirit, to conform to her virtues and to use your prayers, sacrifices, and sufferings for the greater glory of God. One site is St. Joseph Chapel & the Shrine of the Immaculate Heart of Mary (400 South Blvd. West, Pontiac)—one of the six Marian Shrines of Michigan. We invite you to visit this little holy place. You can visit our miraculous statue of the Sorrowful and Immaculate Heart of Mary in our Shrine-Grotto (the small building with the blue awning) and our signature statue, Our Lady of the Cape ("Notre Dame du Cap")-the Queen of Canada and Queen of the Most Holy Rosary-in the Chapel. It was thru one of her traveling statues that the Blessed Mother asked the pastor in 1947 at the Marian Congress in Ottawa, Canada, to start a shrine in Pontiac.
